

# Psychoeducational Assessment

## What is a Psychoeducational Assessment?

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A psychoeducational assessment helps to identify if the child has and the types of learning challenges. It helps to identify areas of strengths and weaknesses in the child's learning profile, an in depth understanding of how the child learns best and processes information. It should also include remedial strategies on how to help the child in school.
